SUBJECT: Safety Stop Regulations

ISSUE:

Update for Mayor and Town Council regarding House Bill 22-1028 passed 4/13/22, which allows bicycles to yield rather than stop at intersections.

FISCAL/BUDGET IMPACT:

None at this time. Future costs may be incurred with signage implementation and/or police enforcement.

BACKGROUND:

HB 22-1028 allows bikes at intersections to treat signals as stop signs and stop signs as yields. Others included in the legislation are: wheelchairs, skateboards, scooters, one-wheels, electric bikes, and pedestrians. The law does not apply to anyone under 15, unless accompanied by an adult.

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendations will be presented regarding the use of signage to prohibit safety stops at certain intersections and the option to raise the allowable speed for safety stops as outlined in the legislation.

SUBJECT: Engineering and Public Works Department Update

ISSUE:

Department Update for the Engineering and Public Works Department.

FISCAL/BUDGET IMPACT:

None.

BACKGROUND:

The Engineering and Public Works Department is providing an update to the Mayor and Town Council on three (3) topics. The first topic will be focused on Parker area traffic crash data and lead by Alisa Babler, Traffic Division Manager. The presentation will include a variety of data associated with vehicular, pedestrian and bicycle accidents which has been compiled through CDOT and the Parker Police Department databases. Alisa will discuss Department safety goals, types of crashes, trends, patterns, current programs/standards and next steps to improve safety in the Town.

The next discussion topic will be focused on the Town's roadway assessment tool/system (Vaisala RoadAI) and will be led by Jim Gilbert, Operations Manager. The presentation will include information on how our Department has been using the system since it was fully implemented in 2021. Jim will cover our roadway pavement assessment and how the system has informed our decision making on the Town's roadway maintenance program. The presentation will also include information on how we plan to use the system for conditional assessment and maintenance of other transportation elements (signs and striping).

The last topic of the Department Update will cover our Snow Operations program. This is an annual presentation we conduct to inform the Mayor and Town Council about our Snow Operations policies in anticipation of the upcoming snow season.
